NZQA is seeking feedback on newly developed Level 1 Literacy and Numeracy unit standards. These standards will form one way of meeting the Literacy and Numeracy requirements for NCEA Level 1 from 2011.

Consultation on the standards closes on 28 May 2010.

Level 1 Standards and Assessment Resources

From the NZQA site:

Level 1 standards have been drafted, consulted on in June 2009, and have been amended in light of the feedback received. They are presented on the pages through the links above. The exception is in Technological Context Knowledge and Skills, where further work is progressing.

Assessment resources for new or significantly changed standards are

currently being drafted. Resources for internally assessed standards are intended to be trialled in schools in Terms 1 and 2 2010. Resources for externally assessed standards will be trialled in Term 4 2009 and Term 1 2010. All of these resources will be placed on the pages through the links above when they become available in 2010.
